Strategies:

- Understand past performance and current trends towards "Twice as Safe by 2020"
- Progress strategic initiatives to proactively address safety performance in the project development phase
- Developing best practices to assist the workers at the workface to ensure nobody gets hurt
- Engage with the Government of Alberta and liaise with industry partners to ensure alignment on safety initiatives
- Gain alignment with industry partners to leverage existing tools and best practices to eliminate duplication and confusion

ISNet Safety Metric

- Develop safety benchmark to monitor trends on path toward 2020
 - Use current industry occupational injury/illness recordable metrics (TRIR/LTIF)
 - Reference industry code 40400, COAA members, and any other applicable WCB construction industry codes that would enable COAA to have fit for purpose data set to represent Canada and Alberta
 - Monitor metrics on a quarterly basis

Strategic Initiatives

- Broad implementation of ICCS across industry in collaboration with the Work Force Development Committee
 - Owner promotion through contracting
 - Promotion by labor providers
- Physical Demands Analysis standards for contractor's workforce

Safety Best Practices

- Promote the Imperial Oil/ExxonMobil Risk Tolerance Reduction tools
- Visible safety leadership
 - Include tools for supervision engagement at the workface
- A&D Best Practices (Canadian Model, RSAP)
- Leverage oil sands industry safety task force initiatives to avoid duplication
 - Maximize their broad stakeholder industry base and resources for developing Best Practices e.g. Training Tracking Database
